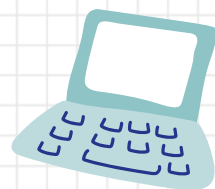

English

English: We will be studying *Cinderella of the Nile*, a retelling of one of the oldest Cinderella stories. It follows Rhodopis, a young Greek girl taken to Egypt, whose kindness helps her endure captivity. Beverley Naidoo blends myth, history and folklore to show how stories travel across cultures and highlight resilience and hope.

Reading: Y2 will continue their phonics sessions. Y3 will continue reading *The Humans: Ancient Civilisation*, where Jonny Marx introduces key early societies and their achievements, helping children understand how ancient communities shaped modern life. Clear explanations and rich illustrations deepen their sense of early civilisations and human ingenuity.

Maths

In Maths this term, Year 3 pupils will continue learning about fractions and will explore shape, time, and position and direction using co-ordinates.

Year 2 pupils will focus on time, mass, capacity, temperature, and position and direction, developing their problem-solving and practical maths skills.

Science

We will learn how food affects muscle fatigue by changing how much energy our muscles have during activity, with carbohydrates offering quick fuel and other nutrients supporting longer-term strength and recovery.

History

'What is a monarch': pupils explore how monarchs' roles have changed over time and learn about famous British rulers, symbols, and ceremonies linked to royalty, building a clear picture of what a monarch is and how monarchy fits into UK history.

Art

Elm will be exploring sculpture through the KAPOW curriculum, creating detailed 3D clay houses that showcase their growing artistic skills and understanding of sculpture and 3D art.

Music

We are delighted to be welcoming Debbie Dagleish back to East Wold. This term she will be teaching Year 2 and 3 how to play the violin. This is a wonderful opportunity for the children to learn to play a musical instrument.

PE

This term, our class is starting their Get Set 4 PE programme with energetic sessions in both football and net and wall games, building teamwork, coordination, and growing confidence in their movement skills.

PSHE

Economic Wellbeing & Transition teaches children simple ideas about money—like where it comes from, how we use it, and why we save or spend—while also helping them prepare for moving into a new school year.

RE

We will continue to study *The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe* in R.E. This unit helps children explore how the story reflects key Christian beliefs, especially sacrifice, forgiveness, hope and the triumph of good.

Spanish

In Spanish, we will be continuing our topic on vegetables using Language Angels, building confidence in speaking and listening. Additionally, we will be learning about the country of Spain and Spanish festivals celebrated.
